The travelling exhibition gives priority to cross-border connections, will showcase the region's architects, who use the language of architecture, creating buildings that reflect the spirit of place and the region's shared historical traditions, using modern architectural principles such as transparency and sustainability. The aim and strategy of us is to benchmark itself and its intellectual performance against the architectural achievements of countries in the region with the same past, history and culture, to provide a continuous and up-to-date feedback on its current situation.

The Association of Hungarian Architects (AHA) has been organising this travelling exhibition every year since 2008, which will be extended this year to showcase the architecture of the region. The V4 associated countries are Hungary, the Czech Republic, Slovakia and Poland. This year, Slovenia and Romania are also participants in the programme. The aim of the travelling exhibition is to bring together the architectural achievements of countries with similar histories, histories and cultures. The exhibition is a collaboration between AHA, the Slovenian DESSA Galerija, the Polish Association of Architects (SARP), the Slovak Association of Architects (SAS), the Faculty of Architecture of the Technical University of Prague, and the Technical University of Cluj Napoca, Faculty of Architecture and Urban Planning. Its idea is to present the intellectual and physical state of family house architecture in Central Europe today. Its aim is to present high quality family houses to the public and the profession. The travelling exhibition will be presented in cooperation with the architectural organisations of the regions in central European capitals Budapest, Prague, Krakow, Kassa, Bratislava, Ljubljana and now in Cluj Napoca. It will not only provide a cross-border perspective, but we hope it will also strengthen cooperation between the countries of the Central European region.
